

abstract	adjective thought of apart from concrete realities, specific objects, or actual instances (abstract things are not able to be easily or quickly understood or interpreted i.e. an abstract painting)	I do not understand the abstract painting; it just looks like a bunch of lines and circles to me.
abstruse	adjective hard to understand	I find geometry to be abstruse ; I just don't get it.
benevolent	adjective desiring to help others; charitable	Oprah is very benevolent ; she is always giving away money and gifts.
capricious	adjective unpredictable (changes a lot)	The capricious girl kept changing prom dates.
cordial	adjective sincere; warm; friendly	She was very cordial even though she did not really know me.
depravity	noun evilness; wickedness	Her depravity was shocking; she kicked a puppy.
epic	noun A very long heroic poem (a long poem about a hero like <i>The Odyssey</i>)	My favorite epic is <i>The Odyssey</i> .
impassive	adjective without emotion	The man was impassive ; he did not cry when his dog died.
impunity	noun freedom from punishment (when you are able to do something without being punished for it.)	The girl lied and cheated with impunity ; no one ever caught her.
inane	adjective silly	Your inane comments are very annoying.
innocuous	adjective harmless	The puppy has a big bark, but he is innocuous .
lethargic	adjective drowsy; sluggish; tired	I always feel lethargic on Monday mornings.
rectify	verb to correct	The girl tried to rectify situation by apologizing to her mother.
scrutinize	verb to examine in detail with careful or critical attention. (to look at very closely)	The English teacher scrutinized the student's paper.
taciturn	adjective quiet; silent	The taciturn girl did not talk a lot in class, but she was very intelligent.
